## About Delhi Climate Innovation Week (DCIW)

**Delhi Climate Innovation Week 2026 (DCIW'26)** is the inaugural edition of the **Global South's** largest climate innovation gathering, scheduled for **20-27 February 2026** across **Delhi-NCR**.

DCIW'26 will bring together founders, investors, policymakers, corporates, and ecosystem builders under one roof. The platform aims to position the Global South as leaders in climate innovation and accelerate solution deployment through collaboration.

With over **200+** partner-led events and an anticipated **50,000+** eyeballs, DCIW'26 will serve as a powerful network effect platform for climate innovation across emerging markets.

## Scope of the Document

This document applies to all prospective individuals or organizations intending to organize events during DCIW'26.

### It includes:

- The benefits of organizing an event at DCIW'26.
- The thematic alignment criteria and eligible event formats.
- The roles, responsibilities, and limitations applicable to event hosts prior to registration.
- The process of submission, review, and approval for the proposed events.

## Benefits of official affiliation

Events officially affiliated with Delhi Climate Innovation Week will gain:

- Official recognition and branding under the DCIW 2026 umbrella.
- Inclusion in the official DCIW calendar and website, alongside flagship and partner-led events.
- Visibility and amplification through DCIW's communication, media, and partner networks.
- Opportunity for engagement with international delegates, investors, policymakers, and ecosystem leaders.
- Enhanced credibility and exposure among national and global climate innovation stakeholders.
- Eligibility for inclusion in official post-event publications, reports, and outreach materials.

# Event Eligibility and Formats

## Thematic Alignment

Each proposed event must directly or indirectly relate to **climate and sustainability** — including but not limited to:

### → **Decarbonisation** \_\_\_\_\_



Energy transition, Industrial Decarbonisation, Mobility & Transportation, Carbon Removal & Utilization.

### → **Circular Economy** \_\_\_\_\_



Waste Reduction & Recycling, Industrial Circularity & Resource Efficiency.

### → **Adaptation & Resilience** \_\_\_\_\_



Climate-Resilient Agriculture & Food Systems, Water Security & Management, Built Environment & Urban Resilience.

### → **Technology, Data & AI** \_\_\_\_\_



Climate Tech, AI for climate, digital public infrastructure, climate risk analytics, fintech and climate finance tools.

### → **Finance, Markets & Investments** \_\_\_\_\_



Climate finance, venture capital, blended finance, impact investment, carbon markets.

## → **People, Culture & Sustainability** \_\_\_\_\_



Women in climate, youth engagement, behavioral change, art & culture for climate, climate communication, citizen movements, sustainable lifestyles, sustainable consumption

## → **Policy & Governance** \_\_\_\_\_



Regulation, cross-government collaboration, south-south cooperation, city-level action.

## → **Ecosystem Building & Capacity Development** \_\_\_\_\_



Entrepreneurship support, community convenings, skill development, research dissemination, thought leadership.

## Event Formats

Partner organizations may propose events of varied formats, including but not limited to:

Events must be conducted in-person within the **Delhi NCR region** during the official Week dates **(20-27 February 2026)**.

## Funding and Logistical Provisions

- All affiliated partner events under Delhi Climate Innovation Week (DCIW) 2026 are expected to be **self-organized and self-financed**. Climate Collective Foundation (CCF) or Delhi Climate Innovation Week (DCIW) will not provide any financial, logistical, or venue support for independently hosted events.
- Event organisers are **responsible for covering all costs** related to venue, production, logistics, hospitality, and coordination.
- Where possible, we may facilitate introductions to potential co-hosts, venues, or ecosystem partners to support event execution. Such facilitation will be subject to availability, alignment, and team capacity. You can indicate while registering your event on DCIW'26 platform through the form.

# Application Process

## Submission Requirements

- All applications for affiliation must be submitted through the **official online proposal form** available on the **DCIW portal**. Submit your final event details (agenda, speakers, venue, and expected outcomes) at least two (2) weeks before the DCIW'26 start date.

## Review and Screening Process

- All the proposals will be subjected to a **qualitative review process** undertaken by the DCIW Review and Affiliation Committee. The Committee shall evaluate each application (within 3 to 4 working days) on parameters such as thematic relevance to climate and sustainability, clarity of objectives, institutional credibility, and intended impact.
- The evaluation process is designed to ensure that each affiliated event meaningfully contributes to the broader objectives of DCIW'26 and upholds the standards of integrity, inclusivity, and professional conduct.
- You can expect a response from the Committee within 3-4 working days.
- Only events that meet the prescribed benchmarks will be approved for affiliation. The decision of the Committee shall be final and binding.

## Confirmation and Communication of Approval

- Upon approval, the event organizer will receive an Official Confirmation Email and Detailed Branding and Communication Guidelines outlining next steps for co-branding, listings, and coordination from the DCIW'26 coordinator via email. All event collaterals and communication materials will be reviewed by the DCIW committee to ensure adherence to these guidelines, and organizers are required to submit a post-event report upon completion of the event.

## Sustainability

- DCIW'26 encourages all partner organisations to design and deliver their events in an environmentally responsible manner. Hosts are requested to be mindful of their climate impact by minimising waste, avoiding single-use materials, choosing sustainable vendors or venues where possible, and promoting low-carbon mobility for participants.
